## Today in:

**Children's Chapel-** After reading today's gospel, the children learn about the resurrection of Jesus, and the role of touch in the lessening of the fears of the disciples.

**Weaving God's Promises** (pre-K through 6<sup>th</sup> grade) – Today, the children learn about the appearances of the resurrected Jesus, including the ways in which Jesus brought attention to the importance of his physical body in the spiritual miracle of the resurrection. He ate with the disciples, and invited their touch.

**Rite 13-** The students will explore issues of faith and trust.

**Keeping it Real and Relevant/J2A-** After reading the gospel, the students will discuss how hard it was to believe the miracle of the resurrection of Jesus. Why are miracles so hard to believe? Did Jesus help the disciples with that difficulty when he ate with them, or when he asked them to examine his wounds or touch him?
