CHOIRMASTER'S NOTES: Today we resume our summer tradition of singing psalms to congregational Anglican chants. Anglican chants are actually formulas for singing any poetic text from the Bible, regardless of the number of syllables per line. Since the psalm texts are not metrical, all of the verses have irregular numbers of syllables per line, which means that long verses require that we sing many repeated notes before each cadence. Sing with the choir using your bulletin insert, and you will catch on quickly to how this works. The singing of psalms is the most ancient musical practice of the Christian church, and we all have the opportunity of singing together in this common act of worship.
