CHILDREN'S CORNER: The Nineteenth Sunday after Pentecost

Children's Chapel and Nursery/Toddler care are available on the 2nd floor of the Education Building during the 10am service, and Sunday School is available for all children and youth, pre-k through High School grades immediately after service. If your younger children are staying with you in the pew during service, we are delighted to have the whole family joining us in worship. Little ones are always welcome.

FOR BUSY LITTLE HANDS IN CHURCH: We provide the following in the back of the church to help with understanding our scripture readings and our corporate worship.

- The Sunday Paper (long sheet) is the story in scripture expressed through cartoon drawings, so that children can understand.
- The Sunday Paper Junior (folded) also explains the scripture in cartoon form and includes a 'note to parents' on the back with great talking points. On both pages the drawings are in black and white to invite your little one to color the story frames as he or she visualizes them.
- Crayons are available in the back of the church.
- Let Us Pray- This sweet little book gives a kid's view of the 'Ewe-charist' using word play, beautiful illustrations, and phrases that are pulled directly from the Book of Common Prayer. It provides a great introduction to 'big church.' Please be sure to return these books to the back of the church after the service.

Parents/guardians of children in 5th grade or younger, please escort your children to and from class, and sign them in and out. This is part of how we keep our little lambs safe.

(If you've had former children and students in Sunday School with us, please know the room assignments are the same as the fall of last year.)

Today in:

Children's Chapel- After reading the gospel lesson, the children learn about God's compassion for us when bad things happen. God always wants us to be near, even when others we love seem far away.

Weaving God's Promises (pre-K through 5th grade) – Today, the children learn the story of Abraham and the angels who visited him. They focus on the holiness of sharing and hospitality, and also the power of God in bringing good news to our lives.

Rite 13- (6th & 7th grades)-This is a 2 year class focusing on recognizing the gifts God has given us, celebrating our creative potential, and learning to interact as a community of faith. Students study scripture, engage in prayer, and enter discussion on a variety of topics which offer them tools for faithful living in our church community and in the wider world.

J2A (Journey to Adulthood)- (8th and 9th grades minimum, older students are welcome) Students study scripture, engage in prayer, and enter discussion in which they learn and practice six basic skills of adulthood: active listening, negotiation, assertion, research & information management, partnership and leadership.

YAC- (Young Adults in Church)- Older high school students (through Seniors) engaged in ministry in St. Peter's meet with their mentor, Dr. Andy Anderson for discussion. This regularly scheduled group does not meet every Sunday, but according to a schedule set by the mentor and students.

EYC will meet this coming Wednesday at 6:30pm in the EYC room. Come early (5:30 or 6:00) to eat dinner at church (\$5.00, Chili Night), and then we'll gather for prayer at 6:30 in the chapel. The activity of the night is Yelling Bee (Whoo Hoo!!). Bring \$3.00 for our stop at Kaleido Sno. Parent pick-up is 8:30pm at the church.
