- **November 1: Marshall Jenkins**—Psychotherapist, spiritual director, and author, J. LIVE STREAMING OF THE INSTALLATION OF OUR NEW PRESIDING BISHOP: The Rt. Rev. Michael Bruce Curry; TODAY AT NOON IN DANIEL HALL

The Rt. Rev. Michael Bruce Curry, Bishop of the Episcopal Diocese of North Carolina, was elected and confirmed as the Presiding Bishop and Primate of The Episcopal Church at the 78th General Convention on June 27. According to the Canons of The Episcopal Church, he becomes Presiding Bishop on November 1. Bishop Curry is the first African-American to be elected Presiding Bishop of The Episcopal Church. Bishop Curry will be the 27th Presiding Bishop, the Primate, and the Chief Pastor of The Episcopal Church.

Presiding Bishop Katharine Jefferts Schori will preside at the Eucharist and Presiding Bishop-Elect Curry will celebrate. The Domestic and Foreign Missionary Society will sponsor a live webcast of the Vigil Celebration which we will stream in Daniel Hall, immediately after Sunday School at 12 noon.

The Holy Eucharist with the Installation of the 27th Presiding Bishop and Primate of The Episcopal Church, Bishop Michael Bruce Curry, will occur on Sunday, November 1 at noon Eastern at Washington National Cathedral. Follow along on social media with the hashtag #MichaelCurry

CHILDREN'S CORNER:

Today in: Children's Chapel- After reading the gospel lesson, the children learn about a friend of Jesus named Lazarus and how he was raised to life. How does Jesus help us when we are sick or in trouble?

Weaving God's Promises (pre-K through 5th grade) – Today, the children learn about the Feast of All Saints. It is one of the seven BIG feasts we celebrate each year as a church. Saints are believers who are in the presence of God in heaven. The children will learn how saints have been so important to the life and growth of the church.

Rite 13- (6th & 7th grades)-This is a 2 year class focusing on recognizing the gifts God has given us, celebrating our creative potential, and learning to interact as a community of faith. Students study scripture, engage in prayer, and enter discussion on a variety of topics which offer them tools for faithful living in our church community and in the wider world.

J2A (Journey to Adulthood)- (8th and 9th grades minimum, older students are welcome) Students study scripture, engage in prayer, and enter discussion in which they learn and practice six basic skills of adulthood: active listening, negotiation, assertion, research & information management, partnership and leadership.

YAC- (Young Adults in Church)- Older high school students (through Seniors) engaged in ministry in St. Peter's meet with their mentor, Dr. Andy Anderson for discussion. They will meet next on November 7, in Willingham House.
