September Outreach CASA "I am for the child".

Did you know?

- Every day in Georgia, 33 children are the victims of confirmed abuse/neglect.
- About 8,000 children, are in state custody because they are unable to live safely at home.

What is CASA? A Court Appointed Special Advocate (CASA) is a trained community volunteer appointed by a judge to speak up for the best interests of an abused or neglected child involved in a juvenile court dependency proceeding. A CASA volunteer protects a child's right to be safe, to be treated with dignity and respect, and to learn and grow in the safe embrace of a loving family.

In Floyd County, there are 75 children being served by 27 volunteers. These volunteers travel many miles to visit with their assigned children, as well as escorting the children to court. We can help the office staff by donating these items: **Gas cards, fast food cards, manila folders, paperclips, page protectors, glue sticks, 1" binders.**

And for the children who visit the office: Snacks, back packs, coloring books, crayons, small bottles of water.

Gift cards and/or checks should be placed in an envelope marked CASA and placed in the collection plate. Other items will be collected in Daniel Hall.

Today in:

<u>Children's Chapel (pre-K through 3rd grade) & Sunday School (pre-K through 5th grade)</u> We are on Chapter 4 of the Story, in which we learn about a man named Moses, and how God worked with Moses and his family to help the Hebrew slaves get out of Egypt and to freedom in a new land.

<u>Rite 13- (6th & 7th grades)</u> This is a 2yr class focusing on recognizing the gifts God has given us, celebrating our creative potential, and learning to interact as a community of faith. Students study scripture, engage in prayer, and enter discussion on a variety of topics which offer them tools for faithful living in our church community and in the wider world.

<u>J2A (Journey to Adulthood)- (8th and 9th grades minimum, older students are welcome)</u> Students study scripture, engage in prayer, and enter discussion in which they learn and practice six basic skills of adulthood: active listening, negotiation, assertion, research & information management, partnership and leadership. There will also be discussions about the coming J2A pilgrimage planned for the early summer of 2018.

<u>YAC- (Young Adults in Church)- YAC aged students (10th grade and above)</u> meet monthly with their mentor, to discuss topics relevant to Christian living as young adults today, their next meeting is Sept. 25 at 9am in Daniel Hall. From there they will travel to the Hindu Temple in Adairsville. YAC students are asked to contact YAC mentor, Andy Anderson, Randerson@harbinclinic.com so that he can arrange adequate transportation.

Nursery/Child care are available on the 2nd floor of the Education Building during the 10:00 a.m. service. If your children are staying with you in the pew during service, we are delighted to have the whole family joining us in worship. Little ones are always welcome.
