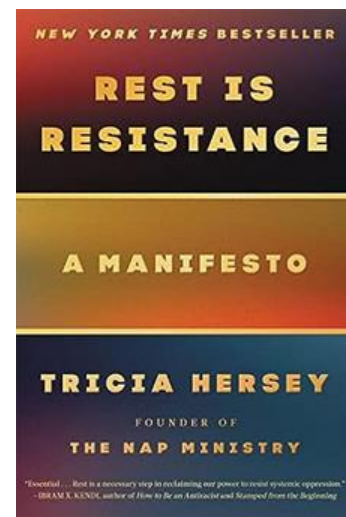
### **Rest is Resistance**

The book can be ordered from Amazon. If you are interested in attending, just show up. We will also offer a zoom link.

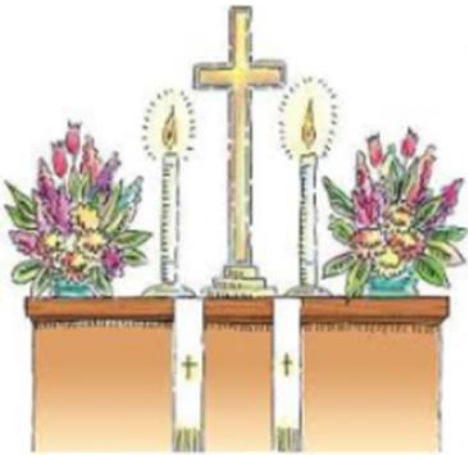

# BERRY COLLEGE Bridge Students

St. Peter's has graciously accepted the blessing of befriending six young women from Afghanistan who are attending Berry College on a Gate Scholarship. Berry is calling these women, Bridge Students – they are bridging their past lives in Afghanistan to their present lives in the United States.

In August 2021, these women fled to the United States unintentionally when the American Military Aircraft that was taking them to an American University in Bangladesh was not allowed to land. As American troops were beginning to pull out of Afghanistan the Taliban was taking over Kabul, making it unsafe for the young women to stay. Now these young women can never go home again. The Taliban does not allow women to be educated so they could be killed.

After a very complicated journey, a kind professor at Georgia State University helped place these six women at Georgia State for two years of intensive English studies. In Atlanta the women lived in the dorms but were paired with families to help them as needed.

After those two years, the only school in Georgia that would accept them as full-time students was Berry College (Yea Berry). St. Peter's very own, Andy Bressette, is the Vice President of Enrollment at Berry and was instrumental in procuring Gate Scholarships for all six of the students (Yea Andy & Jennifer). Berry's Gate Scholarship provides room and board while they complete their four-year degrees; however, the students will

need assistance in other ways as the years go by. When the families in Atlanta learned that the girls were coming to Rome, a friend of Father John's in Decatur reached out to him and asked that our parish help keep a watchful eye on these lovely students who are separated from their families. He lovingly accepted this wonderful opportunity for our parish.

You will hear more information about these remarkable Bridge Students as time goes on. Please keep them in your prayers and watch for more information on ways you can help.

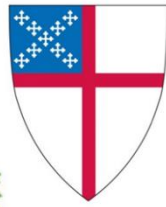

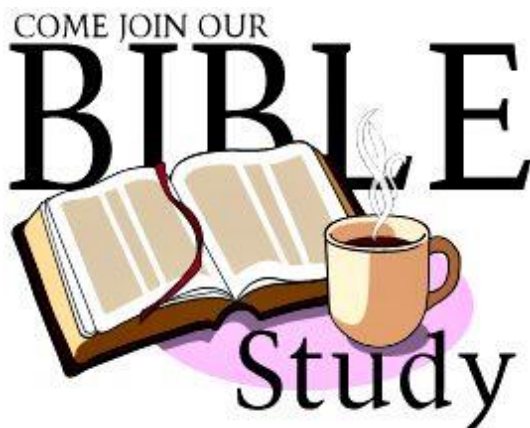
