



We are always looking for more people who are interested in leading Children's Chapell


What roles are there?

Throughout the history of mankind, music has been a vehicle for expressing all aspects of human experienced emotions. It has been used to spread news as well as to document events.

During the 20th century, the advances in technology reduced the need to use music to announce an army or spread news.

However, during the years of the Holocaust, song literature was needed to fulfill the unique needs of people caught in an unimaginable nightmare. Yaakov Rotenberg, who was confined to the Lodz ghetto, explained: "These songs reflect the everday reality. They served in place of newspapers, radios and other forms of entertainment."

This presentation, which is a combination of lecture, images, and song is meant to educate, remind, and to fulfill the obligation to "Never Forget."
