CALL FOR VESTRY CANDIDATE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Annual Parish Meeting will be held in Daniel Hall on **Sunday, November 10, 2024 following the 10:00 am service**. Four new vestry members will be elected at this time to replace the four retiring members. Please remember that the Canons of the Episcopal Diocese of Atlanta do not permit absentee ballots at the Annual Meeting. You must be present to vote.

Parish by-laws require that there be at least one nominee for each vacant position. Once the Nominating Committee has a complete list of names and is assured that each potential nominee meets the qualifications, the Committee then prayerfully selects a slate of candidates that endeavor to continue a balance of gender, skills, age and length of time at St. Peter's.

If you have a potential candidate(s) you wish to recommend, please submit your recommendation(s) in writing -- by email (dasmyth0521@gmail.com - to a member of the Vestry Nominating Committee <u>no later than 27th</u>. You must receive the consent of the potential candidate prior to submitting their name to the nominating committee.



Those qualified for election to the office of Vestry Member is as follows: Any confirmed communicant in good standing of the Parish who is not less than eighteen years of age, is a regular attendant at the services of the Church in the year preceding election, and is known by the Treasurer to have made and fulfilled a stated financial commitment for church support in the year preceding election.

Please note that the new bylaws do not permit nominations from the floor because candidates must be vetted against the above requirements prior to nomination. If you wish to suggest a candidate, you must submit a written recommendation to a member of the Nominating Committee by no later than October 27.






MONDAY BOOK GROUP NEW STUDY STARTING ON 10.7.2024 AT 1PM 401 E. 4^{TH} AVE.

Fr. Richard Rohr seeks to help readers understand the tasks of the two halves of life and to show them that those who have fallen, failed, or "gone down" are the only ones who understand "up." Most of us tend to think of the second half of life as largely about getting old, dealing with health issues, and letting go of life, but the whole thesis of this book is exactly the opposite. 




